Turpin elected to statewide post

Arlington's **Jim Turpin** has won election as Vice Chair-Finance of the Democratic Party of Virginia (DPVA) as Richard Cranwell was elected the new chairman of the state party.

The elections were held June 18 at the quarterly meeting of the State Central Committee in Williamsburg.

Frank Leone of Arlington, who was elected four years ago as first vice chair of the state party, won re-election without challenge.

Cranwell, 62, was elected to succeed Terry Donley, the former mayor of Alexandria, who was chosen as party chair last year but had to retire when he took a new job that precluded his serving in a partisan post.

The new state chair served 30 years in the House of Delegates from 1972 to 201, the last decade as majority and then minority leader. For years, he has been viewed as a master strategist and orator. His home is in Vinton in the Roanoke area.

Byrne joins Dem ticket

Leslie Byrne topped the field in the June 14th Democratic primary for lieutenant governor to give the party's statewide ticket a pan-Virginia look.

Byrne, who lives in Fairfax County, will join the ticket headed by **Tim Kaine**, a former Richmond mayor, for governor, and **Creigh Deeds**, who lives in Bath County in the Appalachian Mountains

on the West Virginia border, for state attorney general.

Byrne did well throughout the state as she emerged on top in a four-person contest. She defeated Chap Petersen, a delegate from Fairfax County, Viola Baskerville, a member of the House of Delegates from Richmond, and Phil Puckett, a senator from the southwest.

Byrne won seven of Virginia's 11 congressional districts. She lost the three districts that encompass Richmond and its suburbs to Baskerville. And Puckett totally dominated the 9th District in the southwest, taking 84 percent of the vote there.

Looking at Arlington, Byrne did much better than she did statewide and Petersen slightly better, while Baskerville did slightly worse and Puckett much worse than statewide.

Within Arlington, Byrne won 45 of the 46 precincts, losing only Glebe, which was captured by Baskerville.

Report from Chairman Jim Turpin

Onward to November!

Unlike other states, Virginia Democrats do not have to wait for the next election.

Our ticket of Tim Kaine, Leslie Byrne, and Creigh Deeds can win in November. On the other hand, the Republican ticket of Jerry Kilgore, Bill Bolling and Bill McDonnell represent the most conservative wing of the Republican Party. It is clear who calls the shots on the other side.

Leslie Byrne emerged the winner from a four-way Democratic primary for the lieutenant governor's nomination. Byrne, a former member of the House of Delegates, the first woman in Virginia elected to the U.S. House of Representatives, and a former member of the State Senate, ran an excellent campaign. The Republicans who think it will be easy to run against Leslie are sadly mistaken. Having know Les since the 1980s, there is no one who will work harder, who is more committed, or is a better campaigner.

Commendations to our other candidates for Lieutenant Governor. Viola Baskerville, Chap Peterson and Phil Puckett all ran good campaigns. They made our choice difficult. All had good ideas and worked hard. This competition was good for the Democratic Party statewide.

For the second straight election, Democrats will pick up seats in the House of Delegates. We have candidates for more than 60 seats. This is up from 40 two years ago. One of the new members of the General Assembly will be **David Englin** who will replace Delegate **Marian Van Landingham** in the 45th District that includes three precincts in South Arlington. The six candidates in the 45th made the primary season interesting. For those of us from other parts of the county, we were glad we did not have to make the choice. We are especially proud of our own **Libby Garvey** who ran an excellent race but came

up 300 votes short.

Statewide, the conservative Republican effort to punish the members of the GOP who did the right thing and voted for Governor Warner's tax proposal came to very little. Of the six who were challenged by members of the "flat earth society" only one lost. That was Gary Reese who was no friend of Arlington. During the last session, Reese sponsored not one but two bills that were directly aimed at Arlington. No great loss.

In addition, we are pleased that Jennifer McClellan, a former Arlington resident, will run unopposed for the seat from Richmond being vacated by Viola Baskerville. We can claim it was what she learned while she lived in Arlington.

Perhaps the most disappointing fact to come out of the June 14th Primary was the turnout. Locally, we had a turnout of just over 4,000 voters (twice the number who voted in the Republican Primary). To put this in perspective, we had nearly 3,000 voters in our School Board Caucus in May. Statewide, the Democratic turnout was 2.6%. For too long, Northern Virginia has led the fight for primaries. If this nomination method is to survive, participation will have to increase.

Even with the low turnout, our Precinct Operation did an excellent job of covering the polls.

As for Arlington, there is not much to say—which says a lot. For the first time in recent history, Arlington Republicans have no candidates for the County Board or any (but one) of the General Assembly seats. They do have an endorsed candidate for the School Board. Some say this was part of a larger strategy to suppress turnout in Northern Virginia. That may be the case in some other parts of Northern Virginia. However, I believe in Arlington it is a reflection of the weakness of the local GOP.

We have an excellent candidate for the School Board in **Ed Fendley**. Ed is the only candidate with the exception of David Englin to have a Republican opponent.

The fact that we do not have local opponents makes our task even more critical. It will be jurisdictions like Arlington that will win the election for Tim, Les and Creigh. We all have to run a campaign like we have never run before. Arlington Democrats must turn out every vote. The election of the next governor depends on us.

J-J Dinner will break-in new hotel

The annual Jefferson-Jackson Dinner will be held on a new date at a new site this year.

The dinner is moving to the Crystal City Hilton, selected because it is the sole hotel situated in Arlington that has a unionized staff. The hotel is located at 2399 Jeff Davis Highway. To reach the hotel, drive south on

Jeff Davis, turn left on 23rd and then make an immediate right. The hotel is a bit of a hike from the Crystal City Metro stop.

The dinner will be held this year in mid-week, Tuesday, July 12. The reception starts at 6:30 p.m. with the dinner served at 7:30 p.m.

Tickets are selling for \$95 apiece. However, Roosevelt Society Members can purchase

The featured speaker this year will be state Senator Creigh Deeds, the Democratic nominee for attorney general in this fall's elections.

Creigh (pronounced cree) Deeds currently serves as senator from Virginia's 25th District, which stretches from Bath County in the Appalachians to Charlottesville.

Deeds first won elective office in 1987 as Bath County's commonwealth's attorney. In 1991, he entered the House of Delegates after beating a Republican incumbent. He won his seat in the state Senate in a special election in 2001.

Senator Deeds attended Virginia's public school system and graduated from Bath County High School in 1976. After completing undergraduate work at Concord College, he received his law degree from Wake Forest University in 1984. Currently he is an attorney in private practice.

J-J dinners are the annual banquet event of Democratic organizations all around the country, named in honor of the two traditional founders of the party. Thomas Jefferson is the spiritual father, having created the party to challenge Federalist control in the 1790s. It was Andrew Jackson who in the 1830s gave the party the familiar shape it currently has by creating the quadrennial convention to nominate presidential and vice presidential candidates.

Englin wins nomination in 45th

David Englin has won the primary nomination for the 45th House of Delegates District in a strongly-contested six-person field.

The district, which lies chiefly in Alexandria but includes a section of Fairfax County and Arlington's three southernmost precincts, is currently represented by **Marian Van Landingham**, who is retiring. Five of the six primary candidates were from Alexandria. The sixth was Arlington School Board Member **Libby Garvey**.

Garvey dominated totally in Arlington with more than two-thirds of the vote there and came in second in both Fairfax County and Alexandria. The surprise was that Englin, a newcomer to politics, dominated the Alexandria returns, garnering more than double the votes of each of the other Alexandria-based candidates. He came in first in Fairfax, edging Garvey, and second in Arlington. In Arlington and in Fairfax, Englin also pocketed

more than twice as many votes as any of the other Alexandria-based candidates.

The accompanying table shows the district-wide returns for the June 14 primary.

Englin was the youngest of the six candidates as well as the newest resident of Northern Virginia. He was raised on a succession of military bases abroad by a single mom who was a special education teacher in the

armed forces school system. David is a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy and spent 12 years in the military. He holds a master's degree in public policy from the JFK School at Harvard University.

David and his wife, Shayna, and son, Caleb, who just graduated from kindergarten at Cora Kelly School, live in Alexandria's Del Ray neighborhood. Shayna is a fundraising consultant and Democratic activist.

Arlington GOP takes a pass on this year's ballot

Arlington Republicans have largely taken a pass on this year's elections in the county.

In the School Board race, Bill Barker has received the GOP endorsement to face **Ed Fendley**, who has the Democratic endorsement, for the one open seat. Cecelia Espenozo will be running as an independent.

Down in the 45th House of Delegates District, the GOP filed the name of Chris Gregerson to face **David Englin**, who won the Democratic Primary.

But when the deadline for filing came on June 14, the Arlington GOP took a pass on the other posts up for election in the county. As a result, County Board Chairman **Jay Fisette**, and **Delegates Bob Brink, Al Eisenberg and Adam Ebbin** all have made it to home plate already.

There are, of course, GOP candidates for the three statewide races: governor; lieutenant governor; and attorney general. There is widespread speculation the Arlington GOP was told to forego candidates for the other posts so as not to pump up turnout in a heavily Democratic area when there is a hotly contested statewide race. But the Arlington party did not explain the absence of candidates.

ACDC Chairman **Jim Turpin** said, "Regardless of why the GOP chose to pass up this election, it gives all Democrats in Arlington a great opportunity to focus even more effort on seeing that **Tim Kaine, Leslie Byrne and Creigh Deeds** win statewide this fall."

Republican Barker also ran for the School Board last year. He received almost 27,000 votes then, losing to incumbents **Frank Wilson**, who received 45,000 votes, and **Libby Garvey**, who won 54,000. Only one seat is up this year, and that is an open seat due to the retirement of **Elaine Furlow**.

The main change is that the homepage is much smaller and confined to two purposes—a place to click a link to the page you seek, and a spot to display any breaking news.

This will be especially useful if we have to cancel or postpone an event because of the weather, but also permits us to alert visitors to any new additions to the website.

20th year of Virginia Disability Act marked

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the Virginians with Disabilities Act (VDA). Serving as the model for the Americans with Disabilities Act, it was Delegate Warren G. Stambaugh of Arlington who wrote and championed passage of VDA in the General Assembly. In tribute to Stambaugh and for the benefit of Stambaugh House, Warren G.
